Dear Board Member,

We are providing the agenda and briefing materials for the May 15-17 meeting of the National Assessment Governing Board. The meeting will be at the Omni Parker House Hotel, 60 School St., Boston, MA. This is a grand old hotel famous for many things, among them Boston cream pie and Parker House rolls. The Governing Board will be meeting the day after the release of the NAEP Academic Preparedness results on Wednesday at 1:00 p.m. via press conference and webinar at Revere High School in Boston. The Board will also reach out to the Boston policy and education community at a meeting on Wednesday evening at 6:00 p.m. to get their input about NAEP and how it can better serve their community. Also, a school visit is planned for Thursday morning, meetings of some committees on Thursday afternoon, and, as usual, the Executive Committee meeting at 4:30 p.m., to which all Board members are invited.

In addition to our standard Board meeting opening Friday morning, we'll hear from the two newest Board members, former Governors James Geringer and Ronnie Musgrove after they are sworn in along with returning Board member Doris Hicks. Subsequent to the routine reports from John Easton and me, the three standing committees will meet separately and discuss an interesting array of topics which will be shared with the full Board during the committee reports on Saturday.

During our working lunch on Friday, the National Center of Education Statistics staff will brief the Board on the recently released 2012 PISA Report on Creative Problem Solving. Then, we'll transition into a discussion about the Technology and Engineering Literacy (TEL) Assessment. At the last meeting, detailed information was presented about TEL and the session at this meeting will provide a question and answer opportunity for which there wasn't time in March. Later in the afternoon, there will be a session on the history and context for NAEP assessments in Puerto Rico. This session is planned in preparation for the release of the most recent NAEP results for Puerto Rico. Friday will conclude with a discussion about how to extend communications about NAEP beyond a single day event, including the Board's communication plan for 2014-2018.

The Saturday general session will be focused on the full Board's discussion of two important topics and conclude with the committee reports and action items. The Board's policy priorities for the NAEP assessment schedule will be discussed based on a staff draft of the schedule to 2024. This discussion will lead into a discussion about NAEP's future role and how to ensure its future relevance and sustainability.

We look forward to an interesting and productive meeting. If you need further assistance in your preparations, please let us know how we can help.






