Dear Governing Board Member,

We are pleased to provide the agenda and briefing materials for the March 1-3, 2018 meeting of the National Assessment Governing Board. The meeting will be held at the Watergate Hotel located at 2650 Virginia Ave NW, Washington, DC.

On Thursday, the Ad Hoc Committee on Measures of Postsecondary Preparedness will meet from 11:00 a.m. -1:30 p.m. The Assessment Development Committee will meet from 1:45-3:30 p.m. with a portion of its meeting time in closed session. The Executive Committee will convene from 4:30-6:00 p.m. As I noted in an earlier communication, there are no organized activities for Thursday evening.

On Friday morning, the Board will receive its annual briefing from the Council of Chief State School Officers (CCSSO). We are delighted to be joined by Interim Executive Director, Carissa Moffat Miller, as well as the Board and CCSSO's joint State Policy Task Force Chair, Shelley Loving-Ryder. Committees will meet beginning at 10:00 a.m. The Friday afternoon sessions of the Governing Board will all be conducted in closed session. At 12:45 p.m., the Governing Board will convene in a closed working lunch for a briefing and discussion of the 2017 NAEP Reading and Mathematics Report Cards for Grades 4 and 8. The Board will continue its closed discussion of the embargoed report cards in small groups to discuss what results should be highlighted in the release and in follow-up. The Board will reconvene in a plenary session to share recommendations that emerged from the small group discussions, and then will conclude its Friday meeting with a closed discussion (no action) from 4:15 – 5:15 p.m. on the 2017 NAEP Grade 4 Writing Assessment and Achievement Levels.

Early Saturday morning, the Nominations Committee will convene in closed session. Beginning at 8:30 a.m. the full Board will meet in closed session to consider the Nomination Committee's recommendations for slates of candidates for Board terms beginning in October, 2018. The Board will then reconvene in open session to take action on the nominations. Board and NCES staff will present on efficiencies for what and how NAEP assesses. Chair Engler will lead a short session for action on the Board's Resolution on Priorities for the NAEP Assessment Schedule. The Board will then receive Committee Reports. Chair Engler will facilitate the Board's action on the NAEP Framework Development Policy. Finally before adjourning at noon, Chasidy White will provide a preview of the May Board meeting which will be held in Montgomery, AL.

We look forward to an exciting and productive March meeting. Let us know if we can provide you further assistance for the March, 2018 Governing Board meeting. We wish you a safe travels to the Nation's capitol.



The National Assessment Governing Board's Strategic Vision (SV) below-listed goals are annotated with "SV" and a number, which will be included on relevant agenda items for Board and Committee meetings during implementation.



The National Assessment Governing Board will promote The Nation's Report Card's wealth of information to facilitate the awareness and uses of NAEP in appropriate, timely, new, and meaningful ways. Examples of NAEP resources include: results; trends; test questions and tasks; studies; measurement innovations; frameworks that specify the content and design of NAEP assessments; and contextual variables about student demographics and educational experiences collected from students, teachers, and schools. The Governing Board will:

- Strengthen and expand partnerships by broadening stakeholders' awareness of NAEP and facilitating their use of NAEP resources. (SV # 1)
- Increase opportunities to connect NAEP to administrative data and state, national, and international student assessments. (SV #2)
- **Expand** the availability, utility, and use of NAEP resources, in part by creating new resources to inform education policy and practice. (SV # 3)
- Promote sustained dissemination and use of NAEP information beyond Report Card releases with consideration for multiple audiences and ever-changing multi-media technologies. (SV#4)



The National Assessment Governing Board will revise the design, form, and content of The Nation's Report Card using advances in technology to keep NAEP at the forefront of measuring and reporting student achievement.

The Governing Board will:

- Develop new approaches to update NAEP subject area frameworks to support the Board's responsibility to measure evolving expectations for students, while maintaining rigorous methods that support reporting student achievement trends. (SV # 5)
- Continue improving the content, analysis, and reporting of NAEP contextual variables by considering the questions' relevance, sensitivity, and potential to provide meaningful context and insights for policy and practice. (SV #6)
- Research policy and technical implications related to the future of NAEP Long-Term Trend assessments in reading and mathematics. (SV # 7)
- Research assessments used in other countries to identify new possibilities to innovate the content, design, and reporting of NAEP. (SV #8)
- Develop policy approaches to revise the NAEP assessment subjects and schedule based on the nation's evolving needs, the Board's priorities, and NAEP funding. (SV # 9)
- Develop new approaches to measure the complex skills required for transition to postsecondary education and career. (SV #10)

This Strategic Vision will focus the work of the Governing Board through the year 2020. By pursuing these priorities, the Governing Board will ensure that The Nation's Report Card provides the country with valuable data that measure and contribute to the improvement of student progress in achieving important knowledge and skills necessary for success as citizens in our democratic society.
