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


Estimates of the Unauthorized Population in the United States, 2000-2010



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Counties Classified by Population Change in the Anglo (non-Hispanic White) Population, 2000-2010





Counties Classified by Population Change in the Hispanic Population, 2000-2010









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
Counties Classified by Population Change in the Non-Hispanic White Population, 2000-2010




Counties Classified by Population Change in the Hispanic Population, 2000-2010






Percent of Texas Population by Age Group and Ethnicity, 2000




Percent of Texas Population by Age Group and Ethnicity, 2010




Percent of United States Population by Age Group and Ethnicity, 2000






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

Unemployment rate in 2011 (in %)




Median weekly earnings in 2011 (in \$)






Mean Annual Household Income in Texas in 2010 and Projected to 2050 Assuming 2010 Race/Ethnicity Specific Income Levels




**Poverty Rates in Texas Households in 2010 and Projected to 2050

Assuming Non-Hispanic White Rates for all Race/Ethnicity Specific Groups**








Aggregate Annual State Tax Revenues in 2010 and Projected Under Alternative Assumptions for 2050 (in Billions of 2010 Dollars)




Texas Age Distribution April 1, 2010

Total Population, Hispanic Population, White Not Hispanic Population, and Black Not Hispanic




United States Age Distribution April 1, 2010
